BACKGROUND

University Medical Center of Southern Nevada is one of 25 centers in the United States awarded funds from the Mission Zero Act via the Department of Health and Human Services. This funding was made available by Congress to support the integration of military teams into daily patient care operations in civilian trauma centers. Mission Zero refers to the National Academy of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine's (NASEM) goal of achieving zero preventable deaths. In its 2016 report, NASEM outlined 11 recommendations aimed toward this goal, one being the establishment of military-civilian partnerships.

UMC is the largest military civilian partnership in the country with over 400 rotating military medical professionals participating yearly.

PURPOSE

Owing to this robust integration, the footprint of military medicine in Las Vegas extends beyond the Las Vegas Medical District: from the Mike O'Callaghan Military Medical Center, to UMC, the VA and into the air transport and ground pre-hospital spaces.

Expanding beyond trauma care into a wide variety of specialties, medics are able to sustain expeditionary skills in areas such as critical care, field medicine, obstetrics, internal medicine and many others while caring for their community.

Approved for 5 years of funding, this grant will produce highly qualified clinicians as well as valuable insight to guide policy for the future of military training and wartime readiness.
